Following is a list of enrichment opportunities which are available to students. Please note that not all these opportunities are offered by Christian organizations. Check out the web site of each for eligibility requirements, tuitions costs and program dates.

School Year Enrichment:

Della Pietra Applied High School Math Program at Stony Brook University

In this program, students meet at Stony Brook University on Saturdays (10:30-1:30) for a three hour program where they will explore a variety of mathematical areas that will teach them about applied mathematics. They will work individually or in groups on projects that will further their understanding of the topic. In addition students will learn to use EXCEL and/or MAPLE, invaluable tools for anyone who is interested in studying Mathematics, Physics, Engineering, or Economics at the college level or beyond. During a typical semester, students will explore several branches of applied mathematics, such as: Game theory, optimization, the mathematics of puzzles and games, computer modeling and an introduction to the mathematics of finance. It normally runs from early February through April. There is an application process, and it costs approximately \$300 per semester. It is open to sophomores, juniors, or seniors.

Selected students from Suffolk and Nassau Counties and New York City will be accepted to participate in a five-week program developed for high school students who are presently in the <u>9th grade</u>. The program is offered during the months of July and August (check program dates with Brookhaven National Lab). Applicants must be U.S. citizens or Permanent Residents and members of the following under-represented minority groups: African Ancestry, Hispanic/Latino, Native American, or Pacific Islander.
