DREAMS for Youth Scholarship Program

Since its inception in 2002, United Way of Long Island has awarded a total of 173 scholarships and/or grants totaling \$482,675. The DREAMS for Youth Advisory Board, comprised of grade 7-12 students, works under the guidance of United Way staff to make award decisions.

The DREAMS for Youth Scholarship Program grants awards in three areas:

- Academic: Assists with costs associated with educational goals at a college, university, private or vocational school. Applicants must be between grades 7-12, demonstrate financial need and a commitment to community service. Financial awards range from \$500 to \$5,000.
- Enrichment: Assists with costs associated with activities that enrich the mind, body and spirit. Examples may include music, singing, dance, or art lessons; driver's education; sports training; specialized summer camps etc. Funds may be used for enrollment fees or related equipment. Applicants must be in grades 7-12, demonstrate financial need and a commitment to community service. Financial awards range from \$100 to \$2,500.
- Community Service: Awarded to a youth-serving nonprofit agency or school, mentoring a group of youth in grades 7-12 on a distinct service project. Examples may include beautification of a nursing home, yard work at a community center etc. Financial awards range from \$500 to \$5,000.

The Gates Millennium Scholars Program

Eligible students who receive a GMS scholarship (based on unmet need) have the opportunity to attend the U.S. accredited college of their choice for up to five years in any discipline at the undergraduate level. Continuing Gates Scholars can receive fellowships in the fields of computer science, the sciences, education, engineering, library science, mathematics, and public health for graduate study at the masters and doctoral degree levels. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Must be an African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American, or Hispanic American
- Must be a citizen/legal resident of the U.S.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or higher on a 4.0 scale (unweighted) or have earned a GED
- Senior, graduating student, enrolling full-time for the first time at an accredited U.S. college in the Fall
- Have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service or extracurricular activities
- Meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria (can be determined through submission of the FAFSA)

Get There From Here Scholarship Program

This program was designed to promote academic excellence and provide an opportunity for outstanding women and members of Suffolk County's diverse populations to reach their highest potential. The maximum annual award may be as much as \$5,000 and can be used to cover tuition, fees, books and supplies. The scholarship is renewable for a maximum of five semesters, provided the student maintains a 3.0 cumulative GPA. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Resident of Suffolk County
- Complete and application to attend Suffolk County Community College and receive a formal acceptance, or be enrolled at the College full- or part-time.
- Demonstrate college-level preparedness as verified by ACT or SAT scores, by the College's CPT placement tests, or completed college course work with a GPA of at least 3.0.

- Must be earning a minimum 2.5 GPA in high school or college.

To apply for the LendEDU Scholarship, candidates must answer this simple question in 750 words or less: How do you plan to responsibly utilize scholarships, financial aid, student loans, or other things to pay for college? Explain how you plan on paying for college-whether that is through scholarships, financial aid, student loans, or a job. Share how you are planning your financial future to not only pay for your higher education but while also avoiding excessive student loan debt.

New York STEM Incentive Program

The NYS STEM Incentive Program provides a full SUNY tuition scholarship to the top ten percent of students in each NYS high school if they pursue a STEM degree in an associate's or bachelor's degree program and agree to live in NYS and work in a STEM field in NYS for five years after graduation. An applicant must be:

- A legal resident of NYS and have resided in NYS for 12 continuous months;
- A U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen;
- A high school senior/recent high school graduate who will be enrolled full time at a SUNY or CUNY college, including community colleges and the statutory colleges at Cornell University and Alfred University, beginning in the fall term following his or her high school graduation;
- Ranked in the top 10 percent of his/her high school graduating class of a NYS high school;
- Matriculated in an undergraduate program leading to a degree in Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics at a SUNY or CUNY college;
- Earn a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher each term after the first semester;
- Execute a service contract agreeing to reside and work in NYS for five years in the field of Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics.

A recipient receives an annual award for full-time study equal to the annual tuition charged to NYS resident students attending an undergraduate program at the State University of New York (SUNY), or actual tuition charged, whichever is less. For the 2015-2016 academic year, the Standard SUNY Tuition Rate was a maximum of \$6,470 per year. The application for 2016 graduating high school seniors will be available in January.

- Submit two (2) letters of recommendation from faculty and/or advisors on school letterhead.
- Submit a completed application that includes a written statement of personal and/professional goals. Applications are available in the Guidance office.

The Prudential Spirit of Community Award:

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards was created in 1995 to recognize students who have made meaningful contributions to their communities through volunteer service. State honorees receive \$1000; national honorees receive \$5000 and \$5000 grants from The Prudential Foundation for nonprofit charitable organizations of their choice. Eligibility requirements: Applicants

- Must be a legal resident of one of the 50 states of the United States or the District of Columbia
- Have engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least in part after September 1 of the previous year
- Completed an application and submit it to a school principal or the head of an officially designated local organization by the deadline of November 3rd.

Open to Suffolk County high school students in grades 9-12, this contest features an essay (announced each year) of 500 words that celebrates the achievements of women to celebrate Women's History Month. The top prize is \$300 (one 9th/10th grader and one 11th/12th grader), and the second prize is \$200 (one 9/10 and one 11/12 grader).
